- Usually, nationalities take similar suffixes. For example:
 - ish (as in *England / Engl-ish*, or *Ireland / Ir-ish*)
 - ian (as in *Canada / Canad-ian*, or *Brazil / Brazil-ian*)
 - ese (as in *China / Chin-ese*, or *Japan / Japan-ese*)

YES/NO QUESTIONS

- If a question should be answered with “Yes, _____” or “No, _____” we follow the same rule.

1- After saying Yes or No, we:

2- Look at the targeted person.

(Ex: in the question: “Will **your parents** come to the meeting?”, subject is “**your parents**”. So, it becomes “**they**” in the answer.)

3- Look at the auxiliary verb of the question. It is usually the first word.

(Ex: in the question: “**Will** your parents come to the meeting?”, the word is “**Will**”. So, we write “**Will**” in the answer.)

Will your parents come to the meeting?

-Yes, they will.

-No, they will not.

INTRODUCING YOURSELF

To introduce yourself, you need to talk about:

Name
Age
Where you're from / Where you live
Your parents or your relatives
Your brother(s) or sister(s) if you have
Your pets
The languages that you can speak.

You can simply follow this example:
